THE TEMPEST — William Shakespeare

EITHER

1. “In *The Tempest* the storm is used as a symbol to introduce and explore conflicts.”

Write an essay in which you describe TWO incidents in which the storm features. For ONE of these incidents you must discuss the effect of the storm on a character, and examine how Shakespeare uses the storm as a symbol in the play.

TI-JEAN AND HIS BROTHERS — Derek Walcott

2. “Ti-Jean represents the spirit of survival. This is evident when he says, ‘And I never learn from books, / But, like the small boy, David ... I go bring down Goliath.’”

Write an essay in which you describe TWO incidents in which Ti-Jean demonstrates that he is a survivor. You must also use ONE of the incidents described to discuss how Ti-Jean’s actions affect ONE character in the play, and examine how the playwright uses ONE dramatic technique to portray the spirit of survival.

3. “‘Little Boy Crying’ and ‘The Woman Speaks to the Man Who Employed Her Son’ deal with issues of parenting.”

Write an essay in which you focus on this theme in these TWO poems.

For EACH poem, describe a decision EACH parent has to make about his/her child. You must also discuss how ONE of the decisions described impacts the parent. Finally, for EACH poem, you must examine ONE device the poet uses to portray the challenges of parenting.

4. “Suffering, whether emotional or physical, is a common theme in literature.”

From the prescribed list, choose TWO poems you have studied which focus on suffering.

Write an essay in which you focus on this theme in the TWO poems selected.

For EACH poem, describe the situation that causes the speaker to suffer. You must also discuss the impact of the suffering on ONE speaker’s outlook on life. Finally, for EACH poem, you must examine ONE device the poet uses to present the theme of suffering.

5. “Atticus says, ‘You never really understand a person ... until you climb into his skin and walk around in it.’”

Write an essay in which you describe TWO characters who are misunderstood by people in Maycomb county. You must also discuss how the truth about ONE of the persons you describe impacts on another character, and examine how the writer uses irony to highlight the truth about the characters.

BREATH, EYES, MEMORY — Edwidge Danticat

6. “The setting in *Breath, Eyes, Memory* constantly changes as Sophie grows into maturity.”

Write an essay in which you describe the setting in Haiti when Sophie is a child and the setting in America when she is an adult. You must also discuss the impact of ONE of the settings on Sophie, and examine ONE technique the writer uses to present setting in the novel.

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SHORT STORY

A WORLD OF PROSE FOR CSEC – David Williams and Hazel Simmons-McDonald

EITHER

7. “‘Emma’ and ‘Berry’ are short story titles that point to the major character.”

Write an essay in which you focus on this theme in the TWO stories selected.

For EACH story, describe the personality of EACH character. You must also discuss how ONE other character influences EITHER Emma’s OR Berry’s development. Finally, for EACH story, you must examine ONE technique the writer uses to present the major character.

Total 35 marks

OR

8. From the prescribed list, choose TWO stories you have studied that explore positive beliefs.

Write an essay in which you focus on this theme in the TWO stories selected.

For EACH story, describe ONE event that explores positive beliefs. You must also discuss the outcome of these beliefs in ONE story. Finally, for EACH story, you must examine ONE technique the writer uses to explore the theme of positive beliefs.
