Write an essay in which you describe ONE incident in which a character uses language to subdue and ONE incident in which a character uses language to rebel. You must also discuss ONE character’s response to ONE of the incidents you described, and examine ONE dramatic technique Shakespeare uses to portray language as a tool of power.

TI-JEAN AND HIS BROTHERS – Derek Walcott

2. “Audiences find the play *Ti Jean and His Brothers* appealing because it reflects the Caribbean experience.”

Write an essay in which you describe TWO incidents that can be considered Caribbean. You must also discuss why you find ONE of these incidents appealing **or** not appealing, and examine ONE dramatic technique the playwright uses to explore Caribbean culture.

Finally, for EACH poem, you must examine ONE device EACH poet uses in the presentation of the natural world.

4. “People sometimes have a desire to escape from their circumstances.”

From the prescribed list, choose TWO poems you have studied which focus on the desire to escape.



Write an essay in which you describe TWO incidents in which a character displays courage. You must also discuss how the character’s display of courage impacts on Jem OR Scout, and examine ONE technique the writer uses to present the theme of courage.

6. “*Breath, Eyes, Memory* focuses on longings or desires that are never met.”

Write an essay in which you describe ONE example in which Sophie’s longings or desires are not met and ONE example in which another character’s longings or desires are not met. You must also discuss the impact of unmet longing or desire on ONE character, and examine the writer’s use of ONE technique to present longings and desires in the novel.

7. “In the stories ‘Emma’ and ‘The Man of the House’ the mothers face many challenges in their attempts to manage their households.”

Write an essay in which you focus on this theme in these TWO stories. For EACH story, describe the challenge faced. You must also discuss ONE effect of that challenge on any character. Finally, for EACH story, you must examine ONE technique EACH writer uses to portray these challenges.

8. From the prescribed list, choose TWO stories you have studied in which there is a struggle against social injustice.

Write an essay in which you focus on this theme in these TWO stories. For EACH story, describe how this injustice is demonstrated. You must also discuss the impact of injustice on an individual or the community. Finally, for EACH story, you must examine how the writer portrays injustice to highlight its impact.
