2. “The prologue in *Ti-Jean and His Brothers* is effective in communicating the playwright’s message.”

Write an essay in which you describe TWO incidents in the prologue. You must also discuss how ONE of the incidents described is developed in the play. Finally, you must examine how the playwright uses the prologue to sustain interest in the play.





Finally, you must examine ONE technique used by the writer to portray the theme of freedom in the novel.
